Mark Farkas is the Executive Producer of C-SPAN's original production series *White House Week*. The weeklong series explores the White House and examines the impact our nation's First Families have had on the building. Following the premiere feature-length documentary, *The White House: Inside America's Most Famous Home*, are six additional programs that feature exclusive footage, glimpses of behind-the-scenes filming, and extended interviews with historians, experts and White House staff, all providing an unprecedented look at the White House.

C-SPAN is known for its in-depth political, historical and educational content, and Farkas has committed 24 years to bringing this concept to life. His first original program, *The Capitol*, was met with tremendous success after its debut in 2006 and inspired Farkas to produce *The White House: Inside America's Most Famous Home*.

In 2007 Farkas was Executive Producer of *Presidential Libraries: History Uncovered*, a 12-week series that explored these historical buildings on-site throughout the country. In 2002, he served as the Executive Producer of *American Writers II: The 20th Century* series, and in 1999 and 2000 he produced the Peabody-Award-winning series *American Presidents: Life Portraits*. Farkas was also lead producer for the network's '98 series *The Alexis de Tocqueville Tour* and the '95 series on the *Lincoln-Douglas Debates*.

Farkas has also lent his talents to international subjects. During travels to Iraq he produced C-SPAN's 2003 series *Rebuilding Iraq* and also used experiences in Iraq and Afghanistan to produce a program on the U.S. Congressional Delegation. Other international travel resulted in coverage of the British House of Commons and an up-close look at the Japanese Diet.

Prior to his career at C-SPAN, Farkas worked in production at Tribune Broadcasting. He is a native of Virginia and a graduate of the College of William and Mary.
